#### TIM STAAB SELECTED TO BE GLENDORA POLICE CHIEF

City Manager Chris Jeffers announced that he had selected Glendora Captain Timothy Staab to replace departing Police Chief Robert Castro as the next Glendora Police Chief. Chief Castro was recently selected by the City of Glendale to lead their police department.

Timothy (Tim) Staab has worked for the City of Glendora for 30 years starting in 1983 when he was hired as a Police Cadet. Over his career, he has held the positions of Police Officer; Corporal; Sergeant; Lieutenant and most recently as Captain. During that period of time, he has held a variety of special assignments adding to his wide breadth of experience.

Born and raised in the San Gabriel Valley, Captain Staab earned his Bachelor of Science from Azusa Pacific University in Applied Leadership & Management. He is a graduate of the Sherman Block Supervisory Leadership Institute and the first Glendora Officer to attend the FBI National Academy in Quantico, Virginia.

Staab has been recognized as the 2005 Glendora Police Department Officer of the Year and received the Department's 1996 Excellence Award for work as the Public Information Officer. He is a twice recipient of the Department's lifesaving award.
